

## Museum-To-Go Classes

Bring the Museum experience right to your school! A Museum educator will visit your classroom and facilitate a 50-minute hands-on class at your site. Museum-to-Go classes support state standards. Plan to schedule three sessions of the same class on the same day at one site.

- **Class size:** *Maximum of 30 students per session*
- **Cost:** *\$300 (\$100/session); schools outside a 30-mile radius will be charged an additional mileage fee.*
- **Days/dates:** *Mondays and Tuesdays year-round*
