

Be a Sand Sculptor

This summer, you may find yourself at a sandbox or beach that can be used as a terrific “canvas” for art! Whether you are building up or digging down, here are some fun hints for your young artist.

- Work with wet and dry sand. Draw a spiral shape and dribble water in your spiral to make it darker and more visible.
- After you’ve drawn a design, dug a smooth hole or built a fun castle, try decorating your creation with rocks and twigs you find nearby.
- See what happens when waves or a carefully sprinkled shower from a watering can reaches your sculpture or design. Your sand, rocks and other materials will change color and shape.
- Take a picture of your creation and start your own photo art gallery.



It’s fun to create art outside. Just be sure to use only material you find around you and that is already on the ground. When you are done, wipe your canvas clean!
