



## H1N1 2009-2010 Q & A

**Q: What is Minnesota Children's Museum doing to prepare for H1N1?**

**A:** The Museum has always had a consistent cleaning routine, but in light of recent H1N1 concerns, we are enhancing our daily cleaning and disinfecting routines. Surface areas such as handrails and bathrooms are disinfected frequently throughout the day. The Museum's disinfecting solutions meet the Center for Disease Control's recommendations.

Hand sanitizer pumps have been installed in all of the permanent galleries and reminders on the Museum's electronic signage boards help visitors remember to wash their hands regularly, cover their sneeze, etc.

**Q: Is there anything I can do to keep my kids from getting sick?**

- Stay home if you or your child is sick.
- Thoroughly wash your hands and your child's hands regularly.
- Encourage your child to sneeze into the crook of their arm, as directed by the CDC.
- Notify a staff member if a child puts a toy, book or other object in his/her mouth.
